Troop 6 is planning an exciting trip to Washington DC!! Following this page, you will find the information for the trip and the forms that you will need to complete.

In order to attend this trip you have to have achieved the rank of <u>Tenderfoot</u>.

Mr. Cox, a Troop 6 Leader, has arranged for us to camp in Leesburg, VA. His father lives on a very large piece of land and has graciously offered us the opportunity to camp at no cost.

The <u>approximate</u> cost of trip is \$150.00 - \$200.00., our goal is to keep the trip as cost efficient as possible. This will include all transportation fees, for the Metro, parking, food, 3 meals per day, snacks and drinks, admission fees, the wreath that will be laid at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, and a thank you gift for Mr. Cox (the dad). There is a \$50.00 deposit, per person, due by April 16, 2014.

There is a dress code for the trip; all scouts that attend <u>must</u> have a full Class A uniform: Class A shirt, scout pants or shorts, scout belt and scout socks and a full Class B uniform: Class B troop shirt, scout pants or shorts, scout belt, and scout socks

There will be a strict code of conduct for this trip. This will be <u>reviewed with</u> everyone attending the trip. There are certain rules that must be followed when visiting some of the attractions. We will be traveling on the Metrorail and touring all public places. It is very important that everyone that attends the trip is able to follow the code of conduct.

Several sights that we are planning to visit are: Steven F. Udvar-Hazy Center Air and Space Museum, the Boy Scout Memorial, the National Zoo, Fords Theater, Congress and the Capital, the Lincoln and Jefferson Memorials, the Washington Monument, and the Museums of American History and National History. We will be visiting Arlington Cemetery and performing the wreath ceremony at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. We also look forward to watching the changing of the guard. We are hoping that our application to visit the White House is approved.

We will spend one day performing a "Day of Service", for Mr. Cox, <u>Sr</u>, to show our appreciation for all his help planning our trip, opening his home up to us, and letting us camp on his property.

Medical forms part A, B, and C will need to be <u>finalized</u>. If Mr. Monroe already has your part A and B, you will not need <u>these sections</u>. If you go to summer camp you would have already completed the medical and will not need to <u>complete it again</u>. If not, please take the time to complete the listed parts. All medications must be in their original bottle with the scout's name on it. All medications and medical issues will need to be discussed with the leaders on the trip.
